



MAUREEN WALSH:

LOVING AND FORGIVING NO MATTER WHAT

HE HEALS THE BROKENHEARTED AND BINDS UP THEIR WOUNDS (PSALM 147:3).

In uffering is one of the most difficult things to understand in life. Why does God allow suffering? Why do some people suffer more than others? It can be very hard to make sense of the purpose of suffering especially as a child when you know nothing different. Sometimes suffering can become unbearable especially when there seems to be no end in sight or help coming your way. Maureen has found that Jesus' sufferings bring a new light to our own human sufferings. She has experienced the peace and freedom that comes with joining her own sufferings to His on the Cross and has taken comfort in the Church and Her teachings that God never acts in an evil way or causes evil, even though He does allow evil to be in the world. God is all good and is the source of all goodness; He loves you more than is humanly possible to comprehend. If you were the only person on earth, He would still go through the same sufferings and death for just you.

Maureen Walsh has had first-hand experience in the world of suffering. She knows what it's like to feel that God had abandoned her. As a child, she experienced abuse to such an extent that she developed a stutter and had deep wounds that seeped into every area of her life. When she was 28 years old, she joined a prayer group and found Jesus in a most special way. Her experience in this group changed her life—she didn't notice right away but looking back she can see how forgiveness, prayer, and her fellow prayer warriors made all the difference. She recalled, "One time I came to the prayer meeting, and someone asked me if I had noticed the difference in myself. Here it was that I was healed of my stuttering and realized that I had forgiven the people who had hurt me the most."



Healing and forgiveness were the biggest steps in regaining peace in her life. They have allowed her to open her heart to faith, love, and hope. As a result, Maureen has learned to lean on the Lord and ask Him for what she needs—even if in hindsight the request seems impossible. This has allowed Maureen to experience miracles, in herself and in seemingly impossible situations.

During one such situation, while at work, Maureen fell into the bay. Soaking wet and starting to panic, she looked







around for a way to get out but found nothing. It occurred to her to start praying. She shared, "After I finished praying, I touched my foot underneath the boat and there were stairs—I was able to walk up. I went down to my boss' boat that he was working on, and he wondered why I was soaked and wet. I told him I had fallen in the water. After I told him I had prayed and that there were steps, he told me that no steps existed under the boat, and I shouldn't have gotten out." She continues in gratitude, "Well, God provided angels for me to get out."

More recently, Maureen experienced the hand of God in her life after she suffered a stroke this past January. She shared that it was only through the grace of God that she was able to recover as much as she has. She said, "The Lord has brought me a long way!"

Maureen has worked in various positions throughout her life—at a salon doing pedicures and manicures, at a grocery store, as well as working with handicapped children—but has found great peace and purpose at her home at Our Lady of Lourdes parish. She has been a member for the past eight years and enjoys being part of the community, especially being involved with the Walking with Purpose group. She has a special devotion to Mary, the saints, and the Eucharist and strives to live like Jesus, "Loving and forgiving everyone, no matter what."
